



Basic instructions for using .....

#### Generations:

Used for achieving a layered look, or protecting an area that you do not want to be painted.

Apply generations on top of dry paint where you want the color to show through. Apply the next color and wait to dry before wiping away. Do this with many layers of paint for a look of generations past.

#### Cracklit:

Used for obtaining a cracked finish.

Apply the color of paint you desire your cracks to be, let dry. Brush on Cracklit (thin for small cracks, thick for bigger cracks) and let get tacky, about 10 to 20 minutes depending on the thickness you applied. Then apply your final color of paint over the Cracklit. Do not over brush or your cracks will become brush strokes. If you need to apply more paint, do so after this coat dries. You can speed up the crackling by using a blow drier.

#### Ages:

Adding ages to detail gives it a richer aged look, and also adds more dimension.

Apply while your wax is still wet where desired. You can also mix it in your wax before you apply. You can use a brush or sprinkle it on. Wipe away your wax as you normally would and buff. If you rub the Ages in hard it will remove some paint for even more character.
